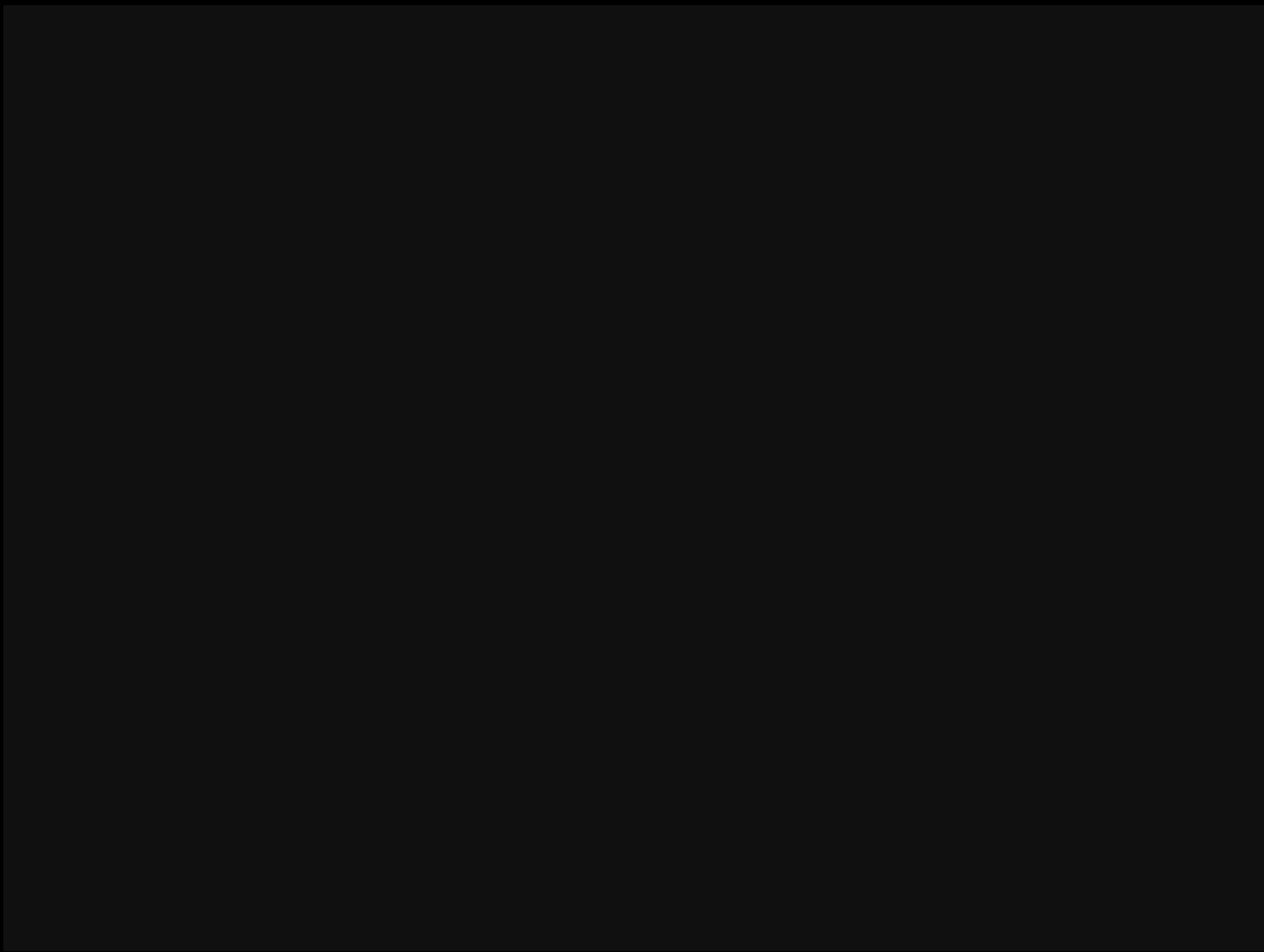

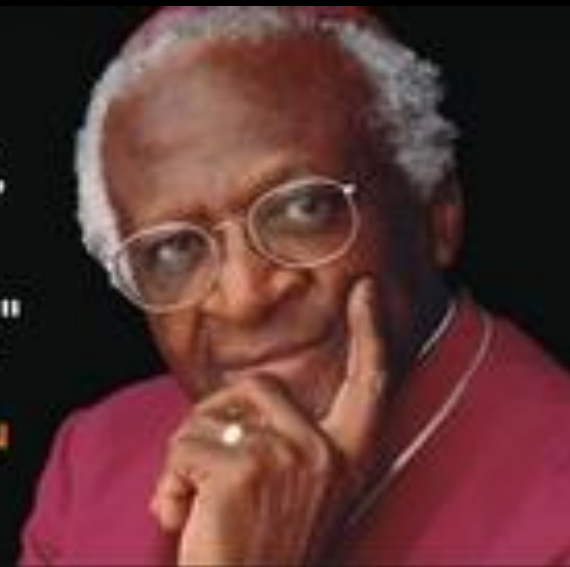
Why does it matter?

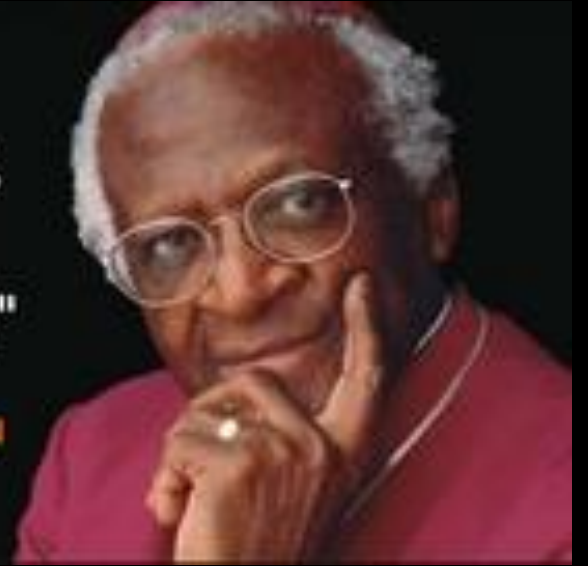
Bullying- targeting others because of difference

Volodymyr Zelensky: President of Ukraine

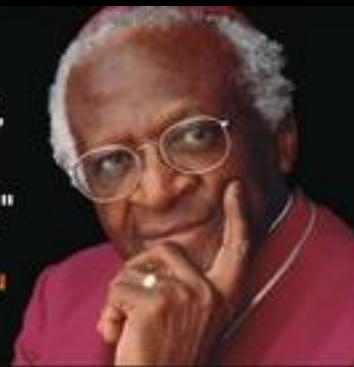

Students at Park get:

- A strong, well-planned curriculum

Reading

- Reading is prioritised within the curriculum – high quality texts are used to support learning
- Park's reading canon promotes reading and students enjoy the time they spend in school reading
- Students who struggle to read are given support and make progress

Behaviour and Culture:

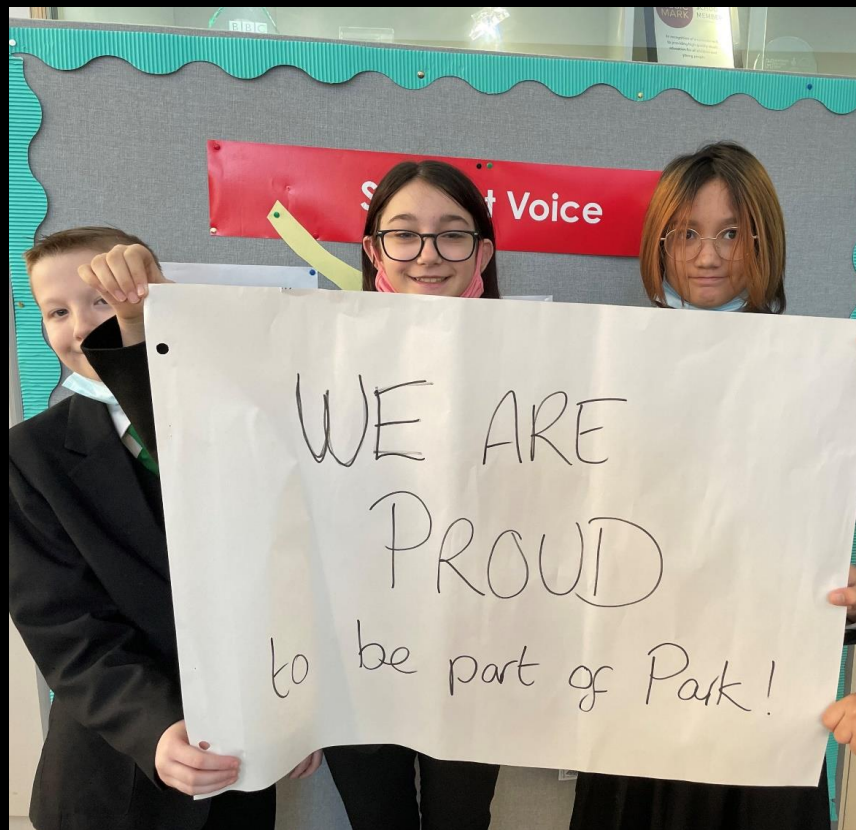


- We are an inclusive school
