Dear Parents and Carers

This letter contains important reminders about concerns regarding vaping, including the consequences if a child vapes in school and support resources you may wish to use with your child.

In the past week, two separate incidents involving individual students vaping in an accessible toilet in school caused the fire alarm to be activated and the whole school to be evacuated. Our alarm system detects a drop in air quality as well as heat. The two children involved were quickly identified and punished.

We were previously made aware of some children purchasing vapes from a local shop. This was reported to the police. It is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to purchase vapes or for adults to purchase them for the use of children.

There is now much more information regarding the significant health risks of vaping, particularly for children. These include poisoning, addiction, low mood and lowering of impulse control. Smoking and vaping are illegal on school sites, whether inside or outside. If your child is believed to have vaped on the school site they will be suspended. Vapes will be confiscated and may be disposed of by school staff.
