#### Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

- English lessons saw a reading escape room where students cracked codes to discover the key to a padlock which led them to their free World Book Day book.
- We had author Becky Jerams in visiting the school, presenting to Years 7, 8 and 9 and completing a creative writing workshop with selected students.
- Our annual Read-aloud-athon took place in the restaurant with an armchair manned all week long with staff and students reading aloud.
- Book giveaways took place for staff, students and parents.
- An open mic event saw Year 9 students sharing their own creative writing.
- Lessons around the school had a reading focus, with teachers selecting texts to inspire and motivate students.


The week was a huge success, and we were delighted to see staff and students sharing positive reading experiences and talking about the books they love the most.





#### **Becky Jerams**

One of the highlights of this year's Park Literary Festival was a visit from author, singer and songwriter Becky Jerams who spoke to Years 7, 8 and 9 about her fabulous booksical 'The Songs You've Never Heard'.

Becky Jerams is from Portsmouth. She first started songwriting at 14 years old and has performed countless shows across the South coast and beyond, supporting touring acoustic acts and headlining her own solo shows. Alongside her own performances, Becky's songs have been used on TV shows, movie trailers, adverts and have been placed with numerous charting acts across the world. As an author, Becky specialises in Young Adult fiction and her debut co-written novel 'The Songs You've Never Heard' (which features an accompanying album of real-life songs) was shortlisted for the 2023 YA Book Prize!

Becky spoke to our students about her journey to become a writer of Young Adult literature and treated them to a reading and live performances of two of her songs from the novel. Some lucky students then had the opportunity to take part in a creative writing workshop where they worked with Becky to create and share their own song lyrics. Becky said she enjoyed every minute of the day and loved meeting our students, who eagerly posed for selfies and asked questions while she autographed their books. Becky even stayed on to join in our afterschool Book-Quiz Club.



# Exciting opportunity to take part in the first Social Media research project aimed at young people in the UK

This research study aims to better understand young people's daily social media experiences, by using a brand new and secure smart phone app to track their social media use and ask them about how they are feeling at regular points throughout the day. This is the first study of this kind in the UK and will help us understand how best to support young people in schools.

All students who take part will receive a voucher as a reward for taking part in this national survey

The study is made up of 2 Parts. Part 1 is included in this newsletter.

Further information will be sent to all parents via class charts, so please keep a look out.

#### **ONBOARD**

Hundreds of young people agree to take part and get parental consent. They receive an email with instructions on how to download the #So.Me App.

### DOWNLOAD & PREPARE

Day 0: Download the #So.Me
App, enter the activation
code and unique participant
ID, and watch an
introductory video.
Day 1: Complete the startpoint survey (15-20mins).

#### PARTICIPATE

Day 2-15: #So.Me App tracks time spent on social media apps. #So.Me App sends short 1-min questionnaires 5-8 times per day.

#### DELETE APP

Day 16: Complete feedback questionnaire (2-mins) and delete the #So.Me App.

#### Have your say on the Havant Housing Strategy

Havant Borough Council has produced a draft Housing Strategy for the next five years (2024-2029) and we want to hear the views of our residents, partners and communities.

The Council is seeking to adopt the strategy to provide the strategic direction for the council and partner organisations to meet the housing needs and demands of local people.

The four key aims proposed within the draft strategy are as follows:

- · Preventing homelessness and helping those who are homeless to move on to stable housing solutions.
- · Increasing the supply of housing, including affordable housing
- · Helping housing choices to enable independence.
- · Improving the quality of rented housing stock

This document will be critical in setting out how the council seeks to meet local housing challenges in the coming years and therefore we would like to invite you to submit your views via a short survey.
