Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

Our return to school last week began with our whole school assembly focused on our place in the world. We explored the theme of global citizenship and what this means for students at Park.

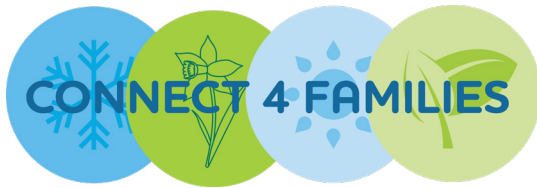

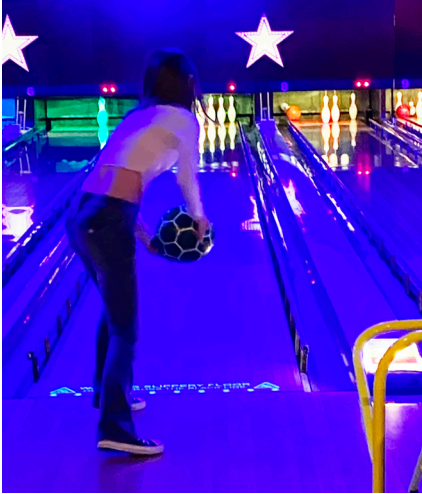
Easter 2024

'Sanctuary' Performance and Installation at Park

Anyone can find themselves in need of sanctuary at some time, whether it's a Greek family fleeing a forest fire, a Brazilian fleeing drug wars, Ukrainians fleeing invasion or an abused teenager fleeing their home. At a time when refugees, asylum seekers and migrants are becoming increasingly de-humanised and demonised we hope to bring humanity and understanding to their need for a safe harbour – a sanctuary.

We are delighted to be hosting 'Sanctuary' at Park for the next few weeks. Sanctuary is a multi-arts project, working with 100 refugees across the Portsmouth area, which leads to a free live performance for schools on the theme of 'sanctuary'. The 45-minute show, created and performed by professional writers and actors, is based on the material produced in the workshops with the refugees and is accompanied by a specially designed exhibition.

The installation and performance have been developed by Creative Harbour and People and Stories. In a few weeks Year 9 and 10 students will watch the performance.

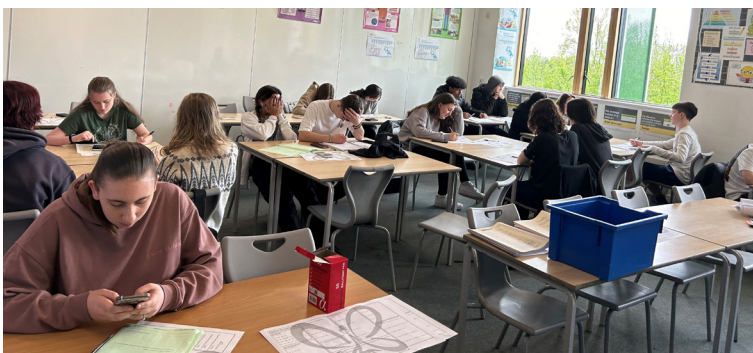

Hello, I'm Miss Palmer and work in the SEND department. I started working at Park as a Teaching Assistant in January 2021 after studying English at university but recently I have undertaken a new role within the SEND department as Reading Lead, working with students through interventions to help them improve their reading skills. I am looking forward to seeing students progress.



Since starting my role at Park I have had the pleasure of working alongside many students and have enjoyed getting to know them and supporting them in their lessons; I have also been fortunate enough to support students on many school trips including Abbey Farm and New York.

I am currently working toward a Level 3 Teaching Assistant qualification which I hope to complete in April. The apprenticeship has allowed me to learn about aspects of school life I would not have otherwise considered, I am now able to apply this new knowledge to my role and have a better understanding of how to support the students.
