#### Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

Welcome to a bumper edition of our newsletter. As always, it celebrates many wonderful achievements and opportunities. It will also give you a sense of the impact of some of the curriculum changes this year.

The introduction of Hair and Beauty and Health and Social Care, along side our already broad range of choices, has been received very positively and allowed practical application of learning in our hair and beauty classroom and in our nursery. Alongside our construction skills, horticulture and catering classes, students are spoilt for choice when it comes to opportunities to apply their learning in practical way as well as in the classroom.

In addition, in Star curriculum, our Year 7s have been pushed hard to apply their learning to new problems for real audiences. This was evidenced brilliantly in their recent Rich Challenge where they captured oral histories of local people and used them to inspire an exhibition.

We are particularly proud of our student ambassadors this half term. Across performing arts, sport, Spanish and reading, they have delivered classes to over 300 young people in local primary schools and our nursery. A special highlight last week was the performing arts ambassadors leading our nursery's rehearsal for their Christmas show.

Thank you to everyone who supported the fantastic performances at Park's Got Talent. It was a lovely evening, celebrating student confidence and talent. In total, £867.12p was raised through Park's Got Talent and Children in Need activities. Thank you to Miss Wingham and Mrs Chuter for leading on this.

Finally, as the weather has now turned colder, we would like to remind you that students are able to wear Park jumpers under their blazers. These are available from Skoolkit in Havant, but we are also selling these at a subsidised rate of between £12 and £16 dependent on size, from reception.

### Year 7 Star Curriculum: Rich Challenge

Monday 4 November saw the launch of Year 7's first Rich Challenge where students were asked to independently demonstrate what they had learnt in their first half term at Park. Over the past few weeks, Year 7 have been studying Identity - The Story of Me and My Place. They have considered how the people and places around them have shaped who they are. For the Rich Challenge, they were asked to capture the oral histories of significant people in their local community.

The challenge began by considering why oral histories are important to capture the voices of their community and how, as historians, they should undertake their research. Students designed interview questions in preparation for a visitor to their classrooms, as well as undertaking their own interviews for homework. On Tuesday 5 November, each class was visited by a guest with a link to the local community including local residents, Park alumni and those who lead community or religious groups. Our guests were incredible, sharing open and honest reflections of their lives and inspiring our students to aim high in their futures. Students posed questions with care and maturity and we were so impressed with the information they collected.

Teachers were asked to take a step back in order to allow students to take the lead in creating an exhibition of the stories they had captured. Students had to think creatively, work collaboratively and show resilience when meeting deadlines - all vital skills for their future.

The event culminated in an exhibition which was attended by parents, fellow students and staff as well as many of the interviewed visitors, who returned to see how their stories had been retold. We were also joined by Fiona Baxter Co- CEO of The Spring Arts and Heritage Centre in Havant who was toured by Warren and Faith. The students shared written, visual and practical exhibits including songs, a dance piece and art work to celebrate their community. It was an amazing afternoon, with students demonstrating real pride in the learning they had created and some emotional responses from our interviewees when they saw what had been produced.

We are so proud of the start that Year 7 have had to their start at Park and are grateful to all the staff, parents and visitors who enabled this event to be such a success. We can't wait to see what Year 7 will achieve next!




























### Winchester College Trip

We had such a brilliant day today at Winchester College. The students were amazed by the beautiful buildings and the experience was compared to being at "Hogwarts" most of the day! We were given a tour of the college and got to see their chapel, great hall, library and many other impressive rooms and buildings.

We completed a session on climate change in which pairs were role playing as different sectors of industry e.g. world governments, climate justice protestors, land and agriculture etc. and had to come up with mitigation strategies to slow down and reverse the effects of climate change.

The students had such great knowledge already about the damaging effects of carbon, fuels and deforestation and all presented their solutions in front of each other. They got to put their strategies to the test by using this system called EN-ROADS to determine whether their strategies would bring down the earth's temperature or not. We then took part in a classics lesson where we were taught the Greek alphabet and got to translate some words from Greek to English and vice versa.

Lastly, we were fortunate enough to be shown around the treasury, getting to look at lots of artefacts that were in some cases thousands of years old. They were extremely respectful and attentive and some even got to hold some. They were amazed that a school could have its own museum and own such special items!

All 13 students were engaged and challenged and got to experience and see stuff they might not otherwise experience without this opportunity. They were amazing representatives of Park and were extremely polite to everyone they met; thanking them for the experiences.
