Uniform and Equipment - September 2025

Uniform expectations remain the same. All students will be given a brand new tie on their first day in September in their new year group colour. These will be provided free of charge.

School blazers, school jumpers and PE hoodies will be available to purchase from school reception on Monday, 21 and Tuesday, 22 July between 10.00am and 2.00pm, and on Wednesday, 3 September between 1.00pm and 4.00pm. We have a limited stock in school; once this stock runs out, you will need to purchase items from Skoolkit.

A reminder that if, over the summer, you allow your child to have any facial piercings, false lashes or fake nails, these will need to be removed before they return to school.

Pencil cases and equipment: A reminder that every student is expected to bring a pencil case to school containing the following equipment: • black pen • green pen • pencil • ruler • protractor • rubber • sharpener.

Students are free the use their Park pencil case or replace it with one of their own. Park pencil cases will be available to purchase for £1.00 from Wednesday, 3 September.

Mobiles Phone Pouches

Phone pouches will also be given free of charge to all students. They are responsible for keeping these safe and bringing to school every day.



Replacements will be charged at £10.00. If a student forgets their pouch, their phone must remain in Reception for the duration of the school day.

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Ready to Learn: Punctuality and Attendance

Attendance: Throughout the year, we have rewarded strong attendance and encouraged students to maintain streaks. From September, we will have an even greater focus on attendance. We will support you and your child when attendance is less than 100% through meetings and home visits. Some students struggle to attend school regularly and support is in place to help them.

Punctuality: There are times when there are very good reasons for being late to school and we understand this. However, repeated lateness prevents students having a strong start to the day and also interrupts lessons.

Students arriving within 15 minutes of the bell: The process for a student arriving a few minutes late will remain unchanged. Students arriving late to school within the first 15 minutes of the school day will be escorted to their lesson and set a late recall for the end of the day.

Students arriving 15 minutes or more late for school: Students arriving 15 minutes or more late will be set a one hour detention after school. If a student arrives after 9.00am their attendance for the morning will be unauthorised.

- GCSE Results Day on Thursday, 21 August students can collect results between 10.00 11.00am This applies to our Year 11 leavers and Year 10 students collecting Literature results.
