Girls Solve: Year 8 Students Tackle Anxiety and Support Younger Peers

Students at Park Community School recently took part in a BeWell survey. As a result of the feedback from this survey, a group of Year 8 girls were formed to focus on the areas that have an impact on school and the lives of young people.

The Girls Solve project has completed 9 sessions working with Girlguiding to gain an understanding of the key areas and develop ways in which these challenges can be overcome.

The girls chose to present a project on 'No Fear - Tackling Anxiety', and Year 6 students were the audience during Freshers' week. The girls worked together to plan and present an interactive assembly covering scenarios in preparation for secondary school and all Year 6 students left with a goody bag with hints and tips of how to tackle anxiety.

It has been a pleasure to work with Girlguiding and the girls have worked extremely hard as a team in an attempt to make a difference to the wider community.

Talk the Talk

On Tuesday 8th July, Year 9 students took part in an exciting oracy workshop led by expert trainers from Talk The Talk. The aim was to boost confidence, improve public speaking skills and help students find their voice – and they did exactly that!

Over the course of the half-day session, students were guided through a series of fun and practical activities that focused on verbal, vocal and visual communication. They learnt how to structure a speech, use body language effectively and keep an audience engaged – all while building the confidence to stand up and speak in front of their peers.

At first, many students admitted they felt nervous about speaking aloud. But by the end of the session, they were delivering powerful and persuasive speeches, supporting each other and stepping well outside of their comfort zones.

The workshop not only played a key role in developing students' self-confidence, but also provided valuable preparation for their GCSE Speaking and Listening assessments in Year 10. More importantly, it highlighted the power of effective communication – both within the classroom and in wider life.

It was wonderful to see so many of our students rising to the challenge and genuinely enjoying the experience.

From Parliament to Park Community School: Sir Vince Cable's Engaging Visit



Educational Journey to Krakow: Students Explore History and Culture

We had a fantastic trip to Krakow, Poland last week. After a slight detour on the flight when we were diverted back to Gatwick, we were soon touching down in rainy Poland. On the first day students toured the old medieval town in Krakow before an early night after a long day of travellina.

On Day 2 we toured the beautiful Wawel Hill seeing the royal castle and cathedral. In the afternoon, we visited the Galicia Jewish Musuem and met the daughter of a Holocaust survivor. Afterwards we walked through the old Jewish quarter of Krakow and visited a beautiful church before going to a street food square which served a variety of Polish foods. Later in the day we visited the Schindler Factory, the factory which is the subject of the famous film, Schindler's List, which is now a very interesting museum on World War II and the Holocaust.

On day 3 we visited the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp where students saw first hand the atrocities the Nazis committed during the Holocaust, a sombre and moving experience for all visitors. Later in the afternoon we visited the Galicia Salt Mines, a UNESCO heritage site with beautiful underground caves, tunnels, churches and restaurants around 100 metres underground where salt has historically been mined. Students enjoyed licking the walls!

Students and staff had a brilliant time and made profound connections to their learning on the Holocaust and World War II, as well as experiencing Polish food and culture and enjoying the excitement of international travel.

Park Community School's international connections have continued to develop during the last two weeks of this term. We have the pleasure to host two groups of students from China, 55 guests in total.

Park students were again invited to volunteer to be a buddy to our guests, with over 60 students requesting to be part of the experience from Years 8 and 9. Our students guided their Chinese partners through tutor time, lessons, Finding What You Love activities/clubs, Much More Than Just A School Carousal opportunities, school productions, performance showcases, sports events, assemblies, motivational talks, English and Maths masterclasses, inflatables and much more.

Each week ended with a celebration assembly. During these assemblies not only did Park students present reflections of their experiences, but also several of the visiting students chose to present.
